





Yesterday all the children attended science demonstrations by Mr Van Der Leeuw, which were really exciting (I went back to see 3 of the presentations because I enjoyed it so much!).

In each class there has been a science focus and the children have been working on projects, with the class winners announced today. Professor Tim Shreeve very kindly came in to speak to the children about his role as a scientist and he will be selecting the final two projects from the school to go forward to the Science Oxford finals.

#### SPORTS UPDATE

#### YEAR 6 DANCE

Ten Year 6 girls took part in a Dance Festival at Waddesdon School. In lessons the whole class have been exploring African Dance and learning how their culture influences their Dance. The team choreographed their own dance with a little bit of help! Dressed in tribal costume and with war paint the team performed an excellent dance. They came 2nd, missing first place by only point 2 of a mark! They will now perform in the County Finals.

#### YEAR 2 DANCE

Ten Year 2 pupils went to Waddesdon Secondary School to take part in a Dance Festival. The theme was 'Fairytales' and our children performed a dance based on The Little Mermaid. The whole of the Year 2 class explored dance movements to the music 'Under the Sea' and the dance team incorporated some of these movements into their Dance. The team showed great courage as they performed their Dance to parents and children.

Long Crendon came 2<sup>nd</sup>. Well done Year 2's! They will now perform in the Finals at the end of March.

#### CROSS COUNTRY

The Corby twins in Year 6 took part in the Bucks Cross Country Championships at Stowe School. There were about 140 runners in their race so they did amazingly well coming 4th and 5th! They showed great determination and resilience especially with a tough uphill run at the end. They will now represent Buckinghamshire and will take part in the Nationals at Loughborough in March. A fantastic achievement girls!

#### **SWIMMING**

Twenty children from Year 5 & 6 took part in a Swimming Festival at Stoke Mandeville School. We entered A, B and C teams giving as many children as possible a chance to participate. They all swam with great determination and focus. The C team especially showed great courage and resilience, as for some of them this was the first time they had participated in a swimming Gala. The B team came 2nd and the C team came 3rd out of 8 schools. There were 17 schools taking part in the A team Festival which was very competitive, with an extremely high standard of swimming. They came 6<sup>th</sup> out of the 17 schools.

#### School Travel Planning Working Group Welcomes new PSCO

PCSO Sue Jones invited PCSO Danny Fahy to our School Travel Plan Working Group meeting this month. Danny has been a PCSO for several years and is now joining the Waddesdon base. Danny remarked at the wealth of initiatives in place and the impact these were having, especially by involving the children through the Junior Road Safety Officers in Year 6. Helen Smith is the School Travel Plan coordinator at the school and first set up the travel plan with the school community in 2003. We have achieved and maintained Modeshift Gold standard, one of the few schools to do such nationally. However, we need more local people involved to assist with the initiatives. The group meet for an hour termly and then staff and volunteers facilitate the organisation of the initiatives in school and support the JRSOs with their role in such. All pupils currently take part in Footsteps Road Safety awareness run by our trained volunteers and scooter training run by Haddenham Cycle training. They are also offered greatly subsidised cycle training. The aim of such is to promote walking, cycling and scootering to school to reduce the number of cars around the school gate area- promoting the health and environmental benefits. Our last survey showed that 86% of pupils used these sustainable travel methods and another 2% car shared with other than their family. Parking near to the school

To assist with everyone's safety, please do not park close to Carters Lane junction as this obscures visibility for people crossing the Chilton Road with all the traffic building up and increases air pollution. Also, please do not park close to any junctions or across driveways. If you see a car that is parked in such a dangerous manner, please take a photo and forward to our local PSCO Sue Jones at Suzan. Jones@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk noting the location, date and time with registration number if this is not clear. It is better for everyone's health in terms of fitness, alertness and air pollution and safety that you park further away from school and walk 5 or 10 minutes to the school gate. Similarly to switch off the car engine whilst waiting rather than leave it idling.
