Reading texts have been mapped out to ensure that there is no cross-over in texts between year groups. When mapping out the texts a number of different school priorities were considered, including:

1) Exposing pupils to a wider variety of text types, such as:

- Non-fiction texts
- Contemporary and classic poetry
- Contemporary fiction
- Fairy tales, myths and traditional tales
- Fiction from our literary heritage
- Texts from other cultures and traditions

2) Ensuring that reading underpins our curriculum by including texts that link with our curriculum areas

3) Exposing pupils to texts that reflect British values

4) To continue to develop culture capital opportunities across the school

5) Guided Reading: Key Stage 1 use Bug club Guided Reading texts and Key Stage 2 use the core texts for whole class Guided Reading
(In Year 3 where appropriate, we use age appropriate Bug Club Guided Reading)
